“Virtual Snow Day” Schedule:

- 8:30 a.m. - 9:00 a.m.: Choice of Special
Students will log into their homeroom teacher’s Google classroom to access the links to the specials. Your child will kick off the day by choosing a special class to attend. Following the special, students will engage in virtual sessions with their classroom teacher. Please return to your teacher’s Google Classroom and access the link to join the virtual meeting.
- 9:00 a.m. Attendance & Literacy
- 10:15 a.m. Mathematics
- 11:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. : Choice of Another Special
- To wrap up the day, students will choose another special for the final 30 minutes.

Attendance will be taken by the homeroom teacher. If there are any issues with the computer or internet connectivity, I encourage you to reach out to your child's teacher via email. Additionally, for technical support, you can submit a request to techsupport@readington.k12.nj.us.

I understand the importance of striking a balance between learning and enjoyment, and our “Virtual Snow Day” is designed to do just that. It's a day for your child to experience the magic of learning from the comfort of home while embracing the unexpected joy that comes with a change in routine.
