Superintendent's Report

- Dr. DeFabiis recognized a number of HBS and RMS students for their recent recognition by the Central Jersey Music Educators Association.
- Dr. DeFabiis also recognized the following students:
 - RMS' Chris Serrao and HBS' Nathan Spicer as this year's school spelling bee champions; both students advanced to the Regional Finals where Chris Serrao placed first and will represent the region in the National Spelling Bee in May.
 - RMS students Wilda Lago, Madison Corbett, Temi Fashae, Natalie Bettermann, and Kyle Chen for being selected to compete in the middle school north region STEAM Tank competition at NJIT.
 - HBS students Griffin Galloway, Braden Hubbard, and Taheem Ahmed for receiving Distinguished Honors, and Siena Albanese for receiving Honorable Mention, in the Library of Congress Letters About Literature writing competition.
