# BOARD BRIEFS NOVEMBER 27, 2012

### Superintendent's Report

- Pupil Services: RMS teachers Mary Beth Schwarz and David deVelder and three of their students demonstrated the school's breakfast cart, which was designed by the Life Skills program teachers to incorporate 21st century skills with interpersonal, social, vocational, reading, writing, and math skills.
- Dr. Sargent discussed ways Readington schools are supporting schools and organizations hit hardest by Hurricane Sandy. HBS is coordinating a school supply collection for an elementary school in Lavallette, and RMS will run an online food drive to benefit the Flemington food pantry.
- Dr. Sargent reported on her recent visit to The Willow School in Gladstone, where she served on a discussion panel with other schools' representatives concerning environmental initiatives.

### Finance/Facilities

- A \$50 Tractor Supply Company gift card donation from the Readington Township Trail Association to the Maintenance Department was accepted.
- A \$500 Volunteer Grant from the ExxonMobil Foundation for the Holland Brook School Family Science Program was accepted.

### Education/Technology

- Bruce Levine and staff from Courtside Racquet in Lebanon were approved to conduct pro bono tennis lessons for K-3 students at Three Bridges School on November 28, 29 and 30, 2012.
- An online food drive was approved for Readington Middle School to benefit the Flemington food pantry.
- A New Jersey Blood Services blood drive at Three Bridges School on January 10, 2013 was approved.

# <u>Personnel</u>

The addition of a web-based Human Resources portal to the district's personnel software package was authorized at a purchase cost of \$2,000 and a monthly support fee of \$31.
