Superintendent's Report

Spotlight on Readington Middle School: Principal Sharon Moffat introduced four students who presented a project designed to enhance 6th grade orientation; she spoke about the BYOD pilot and was joined by four girls who discussed how students would be prepped for this project; and Mrs. Moffat introduced this year's Musical Director Emily Bengels. Ms. Bengels and several RMS actors offered a lively preview to this year's "Little Mermaid" show.

Finance/Facilities

- ◆ A grant in the amount of \$4,000 from Merck was accepted to fund the attendance of two district teachers at the 2013 National Science Teachers Association Convention in San Antonio, Texas.
- ◆ Board meeting dates for the remainder of the 2013 calendar year were approved.

Education/Technology

- ◆ The Principal Evaluation Model of Kim Marshall was approved for implementation for 2013-14.
- ◆ Readington Educational Foundation 2012 fall grants totaling \$5,103.64 were approved.
- ◆ Two HBS fundraisers were approved to benefit the Destination Imagination Parent Group, and two RMS fundraisers were approved to benefit the Starfish Foundation.
- ◆ A TBS second grade field trip to the Theater at Raritan Valley Community College was approved.

Personnel

- ◆ Resignations were accepted from Matthew Hall, Supervisor of Math, Science and Technology; Andrew Hill, bus driver; and Michael Zulla, maintenance mechanic.
- ◆ Catherine Patrick was approved as an instructional aide at TBS; and Kevin Russo was approved as desk-top support technician to support the shared services agreement with Tewksbury Township School District.
- ◆ The Summer Sports Camp Coordinator and Coaches were approved.
- ◆ Filomena Brogna and Maria Winter were approved as 2013 Summer Enrichment Program Coordinators.

Communications

Four policies were approved for second reading and adopted: 2431—Athletic Competition; 2415—No Child Left Behind Programs; 6480—Purchase of Food Supplies; and 7460—Energy Policy.
