Superintendent's Report

Finance/Facilities

- ◆ The Board approved renewal of various contracts for professional services for the 2017-2018 school year.
- ◆ The contract with Pritchard Industries, Inc. for custodial services was renewed for the 2017-2018 school year.
- ◆ W.A.G. Associates was approved for curb and sidewalk replacements at Three Bridges School.

Education/Technology

- ◆ Curricula were readopted for the 2017-2018 school year.
- ◆ Heinemann Units of Study for Reading for Grades –5 and Foss Science Kits for Grades K-5 were adopted.
- ◆ Life Skills curricula for Grades K-3, 4-5 and 6-8 were adopted.
- ◆ A new Autism Class Program was established for the 2017-2018 school year.
