Required Reading Assignment


This summer should be filled with relaxation and sharing time with your family and friends. One great way to relax and refuel is to read great books! Students will be required to read *at least* four books over the summer. Students must read at least one of the books from the list below and three self-selected books. A suggested book list has been provided to assist with the self-selection process. However, you may choose three additional books that you and your parents feel are appropriate and are a “just right match” for you as a reader. Books with an asterisk (\*) next to the title have been previewed and approved by the district. Titles may be acquired through your local library or bookstore. If families are experiencing limitations due to the pandemic this summer and are unable to locate a copy of one of the required books listed below, the texts may be replaced with a choice book.

Read one book from the selections below:

\**Johnny Tremain* by Esther Hoskins Forbes

\**Nobody's Princess* by Esther Friesner

\**Hello, Universe* by Erin Entrada Kelly



Then read three books of your choice. You may choose from the list of suggestions below, or choose a different title appropriate for your reading level and personal interests.

\* *Behind Enemy Lines: A Young Pilot's Story* by H.R. Demallie

\* *The Circuit: Stories From the Life of a Migrant Child* by Francisco Jimenez

*Skeleton Man* by Joseph Bruchac

\* *The Black Stallion* by Walter Farley

*The Night Gardener* by Jonathan Auxier

\* *Invasion: The Story of D-Day* by Bruce Bliven, Jr.

In addition, students will be required to complete the following activities.

1. Keep a complete list of all the books you read over the summer. Record the author, title, and dates on the list. Rate each title with a 1 – 5 star rating, with 1 being poor and 5 being terrific.
2. The reading log can be brought to school on the first day, and students should plan to discuss their summer reading during the first week of school.
