Language Arts – Finish this story. **The water was rising faster and faster. It was not up to the boy’s knees. He tried stopping it, but couldn’t.**

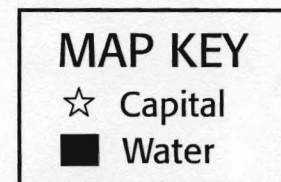

2 Tbsp flour
2 eggs
3/4 tsp vanilla
