Language Arts- Parts of Speech: Common and Proper NOUNS

Once you have reached the webpage, scroll down until you see the activity named "Noun Dunk." Click on the "Noun Dunk" link. You will be putting your skills to the test as the computer quizzes you on common and proper nouns. Before you begin the activity, let's review common and proper nouns. A **common noun** names a general person, place, or thing. For example, the words city, man, flower, and dog are all common nouns. A **proper noun** names a specific person, place, or thing. Always capitalize the first letter of a proper noun. For example, San Francisco and Betty Sue are proper nouns.

See how well you do playing Noun Dunk. For every answer you get correct, you score points. Try and play this game more than once and see if you can beat your highest score! As you play, keep in mind the rules for classifying common and proper nouns.
