### Language Arts - Beginning, Middle, and End

Have your child choose a favorite book. Read the book to your child. (You can also use the <http://www.nypl.org/> (website to access Tumblebooks.) First click on "Books and Materials" at the top, next click on Tumblebooks, then click on "Storybooks", and now choose a story your child would like to listen to. On a piece of paper, have your child draw a picture showing one scene that happened in the beginning, the middle and the end of the story.

### Math - One to One

Fold a piece of paper into fourths. Write a number in each section. Use pictures or tallies to show that number.

### Science - Understanding Volume

Fill two different glasses with water. Next, pour each glass into a measuring cup and record the results. Does the tallest glass always hold the most?

### Social Studies - My House

Have your child draw a map of your house. Have him/her include each room and draw or write a label to describe the rooms. When he/she is finished, have him/her take a family member on a "house tour" by describing their map.
