Science - Testing the Strength of an Ordinary Egg
Talk about the properties of an egg - round, light, smooth
and light. Ask your child to make a scientific guess about the
egg's strength. Is an egg strong and powerful or weak and
fragile? Carefully place the uncooked, ordinary egg in some
soft clay. Using the egg and two cans of soup or two blocks,
make a triangular base to support a large, lightweight cookie
sheet (see photo below). Slowly add books to the cookie
sheet to see how much weight the egg could help support.
Continue to add books. Will the egg break? Remember the
egg has an arch at each end making an excellent structure
for supporting weight.

Social Studies - Matching Workers and Worksites
Print the Worker cards and Place cards, and cut along the dotted lines. Explain to your child that some cards have pictures of workers on them and some have pictures of where they work. Mix the cards up and place them face down. Turn over one worker card and one worksite card; if they match you get to go again. If your cards don't match, turn them over and let the next person try to get a match. If your child is playing by him/her self, they can sort the cards so they match.


