## **Minutes**

## 1. Mid-Year Data Reports

- a. Some initial student data was not consistent with expectations due to at-home testing. There may be score reversals if conditions of the second administration was different than the first
- b. Piloting iReady reading software in Grade 2; very successful in identifying gaps and strengths. Assessments are three times a year so the needs are identified in a timely manner
- c. Running records showed loss from last school year to September; but this school year shows significant improvement (60% at or above grade level) across all grades
- d. We are about 10% below our normal grade level due to pandemic in LA and Math, yet our students are outperforming the normal National level
- e. Math 11% increase from Fall to Winter of students on grade level, and decrease of students that were below grade level
- f. Math domains that were identified as areas for improvement will be addressed with PD training by grade level
- g. Additional programs and supports in Math
  - i. Pacing guides adjusted where additional instruction is needed
  - ii. Teacher training on hybrid work model
  - iii. RMS students using iReady twice weekly and additional afternoon support once weekly
  - iv. Implementation of new intervention schedule in K-5, including push-in for Kindergarten
- h. Extra support program that will run September through December next year for students identified as having a need
- 2. New Jersey Student Learning Assessment (NJSLA) Update
  - a. No update on waiver from Federal Government
  - b. Potential options include a revised test, provide our current assessments to the state, or the NJSLA
- 3. Research: "Environmental Schools: Transforming K-12 Education Through Sustainable Practices" By Dr. Linda Plevyak

- a. Readington has been asked to contribute to a book on our sustainability practices and becoming a Green Ribbon district.
- 4. G&T Criteria Recommendations
  - a. iReady will be used in place of NWEA assessments
  - b. Universally screen in Grades 3 and again in Grade 5.
    - i. Saves instructional time by not testing every year
    - ii. Prevents children from "learning" the test by taking it year after year
    - iii. Identifies any student who might not have otherwise tested for the program
  - c. Project Rubric will be used this year in place of NJSLA for grades 4-7 (for example, develop a board game, monologue, or podcast)
  - d. Due to current processes successfully identifying G&T students, recommended to remove screening of current students
- 5. World Language Textbooks
  - a. Standards are changing as of September
    - i. Spanish books are 17 years old; standards need to reach Novice High
    - ii. French books are 13 years old, standards need to reach Novice Mid
- 6. Spring Sports
  - a. Extending deadline to sign up (lacrosse in particular has low enrollment)
  - b. 4/12 Spring Sports will start
- 7. March 22 Virtual PD Day
  - a. Required PD for LA and Math
  - b. Optional workshops are based on survey from January
- 8. ESSER II Funding for Learning Acceleration, Mental Health, Equity and Tutoring/Intervention Services
  - a. School funding \$164K
  - b. Learning acceleration \$25K
  - c. Mental health \$45K
    - i. Money can be used through Sept 2023 and will be used towards mental health for staff, summer intervention, after-school tutoring for fall, SEL, Equity, and Inquisitive Learning
