1. Board Goals/District Goals

- a. Continue to advance the goals of individual and institutional sustainability through the integration of solar data into the STEM curriculum
 - i. Additions into Science/Math and sustainability class lessons/curriculum
 - 1. Integrate solar data and rain garden into the curriculum
 - ii. Future Ready
 - 1. Future Ready Certification: start the process since it will be in several parts. First will be a commitment by Superintendent, board resolution and technology needs assessment. Then the process of completing and applying. This could be a 2 year process.

2. Revised NJSLA Testing Dates

- i. Formerly PARCC....NJ Student Learning Assessment ELA, Math, Science
- ii. There have been changes in the number of units and length of units. Overall the testing time for the district will be shorter by approximately a day. Letters were sent to parents with the revised dates

- iii. If parents are looking on the State website the information has not been updated to reflect recent changes. It still says PARCC and the web address for the standards still has common core in it.
- iv. More information to come as the State updates the districts. Recommendation to approve.

3. Aerospace Follow-up

- a. Solberg meeting resulted in ideas for collaboration
 - i. 6th Grade Math and Science teachers have been informed of this collaborative effort since the 6th grade is the focus.
 - ii. Progress of how this collaboration will look through the curriculum as well as in our schools will be presented at a later date.
