The Board committees publicly report at our meeting about what they discussed prior to the Board vote, excluding any topics that are rendered confidential by law. 0167 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Education recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on school matters of community interest. In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comment, the Board shall provide a period for public comment at every regularly scheduled meeting of the Board. Public participation shall be governed by the following rules:

- 1. All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer. No participant may address or question Board members individually unless directed by the presiding officer.
- 2. A participant must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface comments by an announcement of his/her name, place of residence, and group affiliation, if appropriate; Web participants will type the information in as a preface to their comments.

 3. If the Board of Education is webcasting the public meeting, the "chat" feature will be on during the public comment sessions only.
- 4. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic unless all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard and time permits.
- 5. In order to provide sufficient opportunity for the public to be heard, a time limit of three minutes for each participant may be observed. Webcast participants making comments via chat may only enter one 256 character comment, excluding the announcement of his/her name and place of residence, unless the presiding officer asks for clarification or further information. The President may, at his/her discretion, limit discussion on any topic. The portion of the meeting during which the public is invited shall be limited to sixty minutes.
- 6. The presiding officer may interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, abusive, obscene, or irrelevant. The presiding officer may take other steps, including but not limited to adjourning the meeting or waiving any of the rules of the Residents' Forum, to respond to a lack of public decorum, or to otherwise protect privacy or the efficient completion of the Board's business.

WHEREAS, the School District will seek debt service aid with respect to the Projects; and

the territorial boundaries governed by the Board) seeks to submit to the voters various school facilities projects (collectively, the "Projects") consisting generally of capital improvements to various

WHEREAS, the Board now seeks to take the initial steps in order to proceed with the planning and authorization of: (i) the Projects; and (ii) a School District election at which time a bond referendum authorizing the Projects shall be presented to the voters of the School District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Township of Readington, in the County of Hunterdon, New Jersey that:

- Section 1. The Board hereby approves the preparation of schematic plans and educational specifications, as necessary in accordance with the requirements of Section 6A:26-5.1 through 6A:26-5.3 of the New Jersey Administration Code ("N.J.A.C."), by Settembrino Architects ("Settembrino") in connection with the Projects and the Board further authorizes and directs Settembrino to submit the same to the New Jersey Department of Education and to the Hunterdon County Superintendent of Schools for review and approval. The Board further authorizes and directs the submission of the schematic plans to the municipal planning board for review, if required pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:26-3.2(c), and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection for review, to the extent required by law.
- Section 2 The Board hereby approves an amendment to the Long Range Facilities Plan, as necessary in accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A:26-2.3, to reflect the Projects and approves the submission of any such amendment to the New Jersey Department of Education.
- Section 3. The Board hereby approves the applications for the Projects and Settembrino is hereby directed to submit such applications to the New Jersey Department of Education seeking debt service aid for the Projects, in accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A:26-3.2.
- Section 4. With respect to the Projects, the Board hereby authorizes and directs the Board President, the Superintendent and the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, as applicable, to execute the schematic plans and educational specifications, the amendment to the Long Range Facilities Plan, the Project cost estimate sheets and all related documents allowing submission of same to the New Jersey Department of Education.
- Section 5. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Board President, the Superintendent, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, Settembrino, and Wilenz, Goldman & Spitzer, as Bond Counsel, as applicable, to take all action required to preserve the opportunity to present the Projects to the voters via a bond referendum at the School District election to be held on in Fall 2025 or such other date as may be available to the Board.
