Description of the possible adverse effects of the pesticides as per the Material Safety Data Sheets for the pesticides to be used, if available:

Exposure route: inhalation, eye contact, skin absorption, Ingestion. Moderate eye irritation. Can cause irritation to the skin resulting in a burning or tingling sensation. Harmful if swallowed, may cause upper respiratory tract irritation.

Pesticide product label instructions and precautions related to Public Safety.

If inhaled, move to fresh air, if person not breathing call 911. If skin contact, take off contaminated clothes, and wash skin with water for 15 minutes. Eye contact, flush eyes with water for 15-20 minutes. If ingested, call poison control center, rinse mouth out with water, DO NOT induce vomiting unless directed. Seek medical attention in all exposures
