With just a week left of this school year, we continue to provide you with communications and updates in the form of this letter. Please see a few important announcements below. Next week will be our last parent update for the year.

### **June 19 and June 22 - Pick-up and Drop-off**

This week each building principal has sent out a letter describing the pick-up and drop-off procedures. These procedures have been designed so parents can drop-off school-issued Chromebooks and other materials and pick-up any student-owned materials left at school back in March. Please understand that safety is our first priority. When coming to the school, please be sure to follow instructions from the principal, limit your interactions with others, and wear a face covering. If you have any concerns about coming to the building and need other accommodations or a different appointment time, please contact the building principal.

### **Families Experiencing a Financial Hardship**

### **Reopening Task Force**

The district has convened a task force of staff and administration to begin discussing and analyzing resources for the reopening of schools. We are using guidance documents from the CDC, the American Academy of Pediatrics, our school physician, and other states' protocols in order to brainstorm considerations for reopening. The NJ Department of Education has suggested that they plan to release a document for the reopening of schools in New Jersey in mid-June. This, hopefully, will be the case and provide our district with much clarity when it comes to the requirements revolving around reopening planning. We will be communicating and collaborating with parents about reopening once further details have come from the state.
