<u>SMALL GRANT – REVIEW CRITERIA</u>

- Must be congruent with Foundation mission and relate to Foundation's stated goals or targeted educational areas.
- 2. Offers an innovative and creative approach to a need within the curriculum and provides a unique educational experience for students and teachers.
- 3. May include fees to cover professional or consulting expertise needed to implement the program, but may not cover stipends or salaries to district personnel.
- 4. May include equipment or resource materials needed to achieve educational objectives stated in the application. If the grant request involves a technology purchase, please consult technology department for pricing information and network viability.
- 5. Must offer students an enriching educational experience that is not already addressed in a significant way elsewhere in the educational program.
- 6. Must offer evaluative means by which the success of the program will be measured.
- 7. Must be completed within the next school year, and an evaluation must be submitted to the REF. Please notify the REF of imminent implementation for possible P.R. coverage.
- 8. Must conform to dollar-award guidelines stated on the application.
- 9. Funds must not be available from traditional sources (HSA, school budget).
- 10. Presents a compelling story that can be communicated to the community and potential contributors to encourage future funding for the REF and thus continued funding for additional creative programs.
