





MISSION STATEMENT






Before and after care is available at both district and center locations.


TRANSPORTATION

HSA/ROOM PARENTS


General overview

- **Self-help skills**


- zipping, unzipping (coats/backpacks)
- taking shoes on/off
- packing up/unpacking backpack (fitting lunch box, folder, etc.)
- opening snacks
- toileting (pulling up pants, wiping properly)
- asking for help (“can I use the bathroom?” “Can you help me, please?”)
- learning to take turns/share

- **Establishing Routines/Key Phrases**

***Children like to have structure and usually thrive on a schedule**

- “first we will _____, then we will _____” (this helps with transitions)
- “we have _____ time left” (timers work great for this!)


REGISTRATION

TIMELINE OF WHAT TO EXPECT
