## **Minutes**

- 1. Spring Teacher Academy
  - a. 25 sessions in Literacy, Math, SEL, Technology, and Instructional
- 2. Summer Enrichment Program Update
  - a. ½ day courses, morning or afternoon, 3 or 5 days
  - b. Looking to open 2/12 for pre-registration to identify how many facilitators will be needed
  - c. Categories are Arts and Crafts, Kitchen Creations, and Stem
- 3. New Jersey Student Learning Assessment (NJSLA) Update
  - a. As of today, State has not canceled NJSLA for 2020 (must be decided by the Federal Gov't 3/15)
  - b. State is allowing to administer the test virtually
  - c. Assessment would take a half day
  - d. Preparation for assessment is 6 days of instructional time under normal circumstances
- 4. Plans for Additional Math Time at RMS
  - a. Looking into options to provide an additional 30-60 minutes of instructional time per week
- 5. GoGuardian Beacon Update and Policy
  - a. Filtering, Classroom Management (RMS only), and Beacon are the 3 products we use
  - b. Beacon (Self Harm Monitoring) will be for RMS only
  - c. Communication out to parents after policy approval
- 6. Student Observers from TCNJ as part of our PDSN (Professional Development School Network)
  - a. TCNJ students will observe (virtually) literacy classrooms beginning in March
