## 1. 2019-2020 Audit Results - William Colantano & Jonathan Weiss (BKC, CPA's)

- a. No final report yet; presentation provided by auditors. Should expect to receive in near future
- b. Reviewed revenues, expenses and surplus
- c. Minimal change in revenues and expenses
- d. Surplus Fund Balance, Capital Reserve \$4.3 Million
- e. Overall, demonstrates excellent management of revenue and expenses. Comfortable surplus for capital projects
- f. Enrollment declined 27% in last 10 years: 2011 2,040 2020 1,490 Difference of 550 students, spread over 9 grades
- g. No recommendations that require corrective action

### **2. 2020-2021 Capital Projects**

- a. RMS Well New equipment being installed, will need approval to turn back on from DEP
- b. Future Bond Act Taking a long time we've made an application and state must review.
- c. Other Projects (IT) Each main office has red phone for emergencies, (Maintenance) Painting Projects, Wireless Back-up for phone lines

#### 3. 2021-2022 Proposed Capital / Maintenance Projects

- a. Discussed Capital Reserve Projects (\$3 Million), Maintenance Reserve Projects (\$450,000) and Potential Projects Under Investigation
- b. \$52,000 Emergency Fund
- c. Capital: Discussion regarding additional alternate roof projects at HBS & RMS(over 100 wing) and bleachers in back gym
- d. Maintenance: wall tiles in RMS hallway, and water bottle filling stations. Revisit bathrooms/locker rooms at RMS

#### 4. Upcoming Bids

- a. Architect Presentation and discussion of various steps taken and tight timeline
- b. Food Service Discussed recommendations from Green Committee, good idea to move away from plastic, difficult year financially for food service

#### 5. Preschool & Non-Resident Staff Tuition Rates 2021-2022

- a. Discussed increasing cost of Preschool \$15/month, suggested freezing tuition at this time, possible good faith effort
- 6. Substitute Rates & Minimum Wage Tabled to January 28
  - a. Competitive rates but nearby district offers higher rates
  - b. Able to staff as needed
- 7. 2020-2021 Budget Update
  - a. CARES / ESSER Grant amounts lowered from \$4,392 to \$2,196 in funding
  - b. Legal Updates 2nd federal stimulus, No Surprises Act
  - c. NJEHP started January 1, 2021 (next open enrollment is July 1, 2021)
  - d. COVID-19 costs
