## **Agenda**

1. Summer Enrichment Status/Update: Mrs. Ogden had a successful program. 14 courses ran and 91 students attended. The Board did not have to subsidize the program.

## 2. Curriculum Revisions

Most changes are due to QSAC but not limited to the following: Scope and Sequence is now called Pacing Guide Interdisciplinary connections were added

- 3. Honors Continuation Requirement (attachment 3): In order to create consistency through the honors and advanced Math and LA programs a more formal requirement is needed in regard to minimum grades required. Letters will indicate students must maintain an 80% average to continue in honors. The letters will be sent out to parents, posted on website and followed through throughout the year.
- 4. NJSLA Timeline: New State Testing Standards scores are not officially available; however, preliminary confidential scores have been released with strong wording for them to not be released. Official data file will not be released until September with a 60 day turn around. Parents will not get paper results until the end of September.
- 5. Chromebook Practices for RMS: In past years tracking overall impact of Chromebook Take Home Initiative, the trend to keep devices running reliably has become inefficient in many cases. New procedure will be to keep Chromebooks in school only.

## **Curriculum Revision Summaries**

#### ELA (grade 8)

The following items have been added to this curriculum document: a link to the accommodations and modifications list posted on website, key skills to pacing guide, interdisciplinary connections, 21st Century Skills, core materials, and supporting materials. There are also revisions in the assessment portion where the assessments have been reorganized and relabeled.

### Music Curriculum (all grades)

The music curricula have been divided into grade bands of K-2, 3-5, and 6-8. In each document, the purpose and overview section was condensed. The NJSLS for Visual and Performing Arts were added in addition to the National Core Arts Standards. The pacing guide was reorganized, and key skills were separated by months. A link to the accommodations and modifications list posted on the district website was placed in the assessment section, and the assessment section for each unit was revised to include formative, summative, benchmark, and alternative assessments. Interdisciplinary Connections with corresponding activities, 21st Century Skills with corresponding activities, and core materials were added at each grade level.

## ELA (grade 3)

In 3rd Grade, the standards and the teaching points of the ELA curriculum remains unchanged. The pacing guide was reorganized, and key skills were added to each unit.
