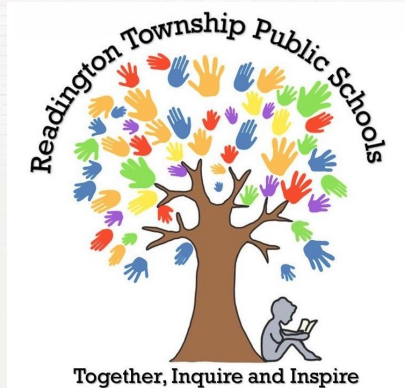



- Continue implementation of interest inventories;
- Continue 3rd grade inquiry projects;
- Use an updated *Data Conversation Guide* to enhance inquiry when looking at data.

HBS

- Continue implementation of interest inventories;
- Continue a 5th grade inquiry project/inquiry research unit;
- Use an updated *Data Conversation Guide* to enhance inquiry when looking at data;
- Teacher experts conduct an inquiry project with grade 5 teachers.

RMS

- Continue 8th grade Civics passion projects and fair;
- Pilot new elective courses while enhancing Civics and Computer Science;
- Use an updated *Data Conversation Guide* to enhance inquiry when looking at data.

District

- Enhance professional learning within the district and outside;
- Use an inquiry consultant to provide workshops and consult in terms of deeper level questions;
- Continue the teacher inquiry projects/workshops and identify teacher experts;
- Support teacher experts in their inquiry projects.

- ✘ NJSLA data that indicates several areas of strength and areas for improvement;
- ✘ Sheltered English Instruction (SEI);
- ✘ Focus on math at RMS and looking into long-term achievement at HCRHS;
- ✘ *Data Conversation Guide* revisions & use;
- ✘ Enhancing the use of data to guide instructional decision-making;
- ✘ Continued partnership with YMCA;
- ✘ Schedule revisions to maximize instructional time.
